Before everyone became smartphone filmmakers, the P300 was shooting 1080p videos that could make your vacation clips actually watchable. The stereo mics? They capture ambient noise so well you'll hear the exact moment your latte went cold.

Special Effects That Don't Suck

Nikon tossed in creative filters like:

Miniature Mode (Make cities look like toy sets)

Selective Color (For that dramatic Instagram flair)
